
The hospital is known for its advanced medical technology, child-friendly environment, and commitment to enhancing patient well-being. It also plays a vital role in research, education, and training.



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Led by Dr. Tastsuhiro Ochiai and Dr. Chika Mizuno, the department is staffed by expert orthopedic surgeons who use advanced diagnostic tools and treatment techniques. The staff is very approachable making the working environment very dynamic.

During my visit, I had the opportunity to observe the medical team as they assessed and treated various pediatric orthopedic patients. I was particularly impressed by the focus on patient-centered care, with the physicians taking the time to carefully explain diagnoses and treatment plans to both the children and their families. I also joined the daily ward rounds and some of the surgeries.



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Day 1

From the moment I arrived at the hospital, I was struck by the level of organization and attention to detail. After a brief hospital tour and orientation, I joined the medical team on their daily ward rounds. It quickly became apparent that the doctors maintain excellent relationships with both the hospital staff and their young patients. The interactions with the patients were notably friendly and comforting

I was then able to join the surgeries scheduled for the day. Both cases were interesting and unique learning experiences.

Day 2

After ward rounds and a short surgery, I was asked to give a brief lecture to the staff about my experience in treating severe Blount's Disease using gradual correction via the Ilizarov technique.

Shortly thereafter, the staff kindly prepared a welcome dinner. This allowed me to meet more people working at Miyagi Children's Hospital and get to know them better. It was a very enjoyable evening.



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Days 3-4

The next two days were filled with observing and assisting with outpatient consultations. I was also able to assist in some outpatient procedures such as Ponseti casting for clubfoot and Botox injections. I was particularly impressed by the organized and efficient patient flow, as well as the meticulous documentation of each case.

Day 5

My last day was for Orthotic consultations. I got a first-hand look at the process of prescribing and fitting pediatric orthoses, including ankle-foot orthoses, knee-ankle-foot orthoses, and spinal braces. I was very amazed at the variety of orthotics as well as the customizable options available.

Overall, my visit to Miyagi Children's Hospital was a very enriching experience.
